APPOINTMENT OF A CLAN SEMESCHAL DY AUSTRALIA

At the first meeting of the Society Executive it was unanimously decided that a Clan Seneschal in Australia should be appointed. Such an appointment is provided for under paragraph 8 of the constitution which states in two notes to the paragraph:

- i When there is no Clan Chieftain resident in Australia the Society Executive may appoint a Soneschal to act in place of the Chieftain. Such appointment is to be for a two year period which may be extended, as required, by the Society Executive.
- ii The duties and responsibilities of the Senoschal are to act as Clan Custodian in Australia; to guard the Mythology, Traditions, History and Perquisites of the Clan within Australia, until such time as a Chieftain, resident in Australia, is appointed.

It will be noted that the Seneschal's duties and responsibilities refer to the Clan as a whole, rather that the Clan Society, and such an appointment can only be made when there is not a resident Clan Chieftain in Australia. Therefore, the Society Executive considers the Clan Seneschal to be the titular head of the Clan in Australia.

The Executive has appointed Charles R. Macphee of 717 Burwood Highway, Ferntree Gully, Vic, 3156, as Seneschal for 1976/77. Charles was one of the originals who started this Society in May 1974, he is a retired marine engineer, aged 73; he lives in retirement with his daughter Kaye, having moved to Victoria from Sydney in 1974. His son Ian is the Federal member for Balaclava. Charles is well versed in Clan - and Scottish - matters and has visited Colonsay on several occasions; I am sure our Society will benefit from his appointment. A brief message from our brand new Seneschal follows:

"Fellow Macfies,

The Executive of our Society have seen fit to appoint me as Seneschal of the Clan in Australia, and I take this opportunity to express my appreciation of the great honour thus conferred. I hope that I may be able to make some small contribution to the furtherance of our Clan interests in Australia and with contacts overseas.

Thanks to the dedication and persoverance of our President, often, I regret to say, in the face of apathy and frustation, our Society has now the largest membership of any Macfie Society in the world. However, membership is not enough to create and maintain a worthwhile society, it requires the ACTIVE participation of all members in the affairs of the Society.

Let us all resolve that during 1976, and beyond, we will actively support our President and State Vice Presidents in their efforts to advance Clan interests and particularly gatherings arranged for our enjoyment and thus consolidate and expand our Society for the benefit of numbers and the honour of our ancient Clan.

HOTORARY TELBERSHIP

At the first mooting of the Society Executive it was unanimously agreed that Honorary Hembership of The Macfie Clan Society of Australia should be extended to Dr Earle Douglas MacPhee of Vancouver in recognition of his never ceasing work on behalf of the Clan. In accepting this distinction Dr Earle wrote:

"I am very proud and happy to be granted Honorary Membership in The Macfie Clan Society of Australia...the important thing to me is that, within my lifetime, members of the Clan have begun to feel that they are part of the Clan.

Our Clan were very humble folk. For this reason they did not enter the game of inter-tribal battles, save as followers. It is true that within the last 50 or 100 years our people have begun to load others in fields other than war. It now behaves us to encourage the young members of our Clan to fit themselves for leadership in 'whatsoever things are of good report'."

The three provincial MacPhee Clan Societies in Canada have formed a national body, and one of its first acts was to appoint Dr Earle as Clan Seneschal in Canada.

SOCIETY EXECUTIVE HEETINGS

You will no doubt remember from the last Newsbulletin (if you could read it) that we were inundated with nominations for the various positions on the Society Executive, and that the three characters who did nominate were promptly declared elected. Wee the three quickly called a neeting via the letter box and added to their number by appointing Charles Naephoe as Clan Seneschal in Australia, Ross NePhoe to fill the vacant Treasurer slot, and Bruce NePhie as Victorian Vice President. They also confirmed the tasks of our three hard working girls - Helen NePhie, Secretary, and North NePhoe and



Margaret Phoo, Historians.

Othor decisions taken by the Executive were:

- (1) That a Trust Fund would be established to provide a financial reserve whereby assistance may be offered to needy members of the Clan should the occasion so arise.
- (2) That membership of our Society be extended to Clan members living in New Zealand pending the formation of a Macfie Clan Society over there.
- (3) That now membership subscriptions paid on or after 1st November in any year are to be credited as the subscription for the ensuing year.

Details of decisions regarding Society finances follow :

A CALL FOR FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Hombers will have noticed that the account attached to this Newsbulletin contains two new requests for financial support. Later in the Newsbulletin a copy of the 1975 Balance Sheet may be found - it discloses a loss for the year of \$52.23 (brought about by the fact that 5 Newsbulletins were sent out during the year instead of the usual 4, and that a draft constitution was submitted to nembers and provision was made for pre-paying return postage on voting papers.).

- Thank goodness we didn't have to finance a ballot for the election of office bearers -

The Executive have discussed the financial problem at length and are unanimous in agreeing that any significant increase in nembership fees is to be used only as a last resert. They are adapant that annual subscriptions must be kept within the scope of all members' finances. However, Society finances must be put on a more sound footing than they are at present, and, as mentioned earlier, the Executive wish to establish a Trust Fund to assist Clan members in need. Thus, with the idea that those members who are better off financially may wish to help, the following decisions have been made by the Executive:

- (1) The 1976 annual subscription remains at \$2 per member.
- (2) The 1977 annual subscription will be 53 per member.
- (3) A Voluntary Lovy (if we can call it that) of 33 is placed on all members for the Trust Fund. Thile it is realised that some may not be able to afford this amount, we ask all of you to carnestly consider it.
- (4) All nombers are asked to pay a Voluntary Donation of up to 55 towards the Society's general funds. For those who can afford it we assure you that your donation will be well utilized; if you are unable to afford it we assure you that your annual subscription will cover your membership obligation in this regard.

I stress again that the Trust Fund Levy and the General Fund Donation are both voluntary and are not intended to bring any financial hardship to any member.
