COLONSAY VILLAGE HALL PROGRESS

Further Assistance Will Be Welcome

Progress with the Colonsay Village Hall Project is moving ahead as the following update received from Georgina Hobhouse on 11th March indicates. Final approval on funding subsidies is awaited before contracts are signed with a projected completion date of the end of this year. While the basic construction costs will be well covered by subsidy, the Hall Committee is still actively fundraising to provide for a number of extras to put icing on the Hall cake as it were. Clan Macfie has already made a contribution and is considering a second one. Some Clan Macfie Societies and Clan members have also made donations. It would be timely though if we all considered helping the Committee further in their final year. Our combined support will cement the Clan ties with Colonsay, our historic homeland. Please think about it. Georgina's Report

"Around fifteen residents from Colonsay set off for the mainland last weekend to host a Dinner Dance and Ceilidh in the Carrick Hotel, Glasgow. The event was attended by a hundred 'ex-patriot' Colosachs and long standing friends of the island who all welcomed the opportunity to meet and to help raise funds for the New Hall. Hector MacFadyen and his band, who donated their services, played lively dance music until the small hours and were much appreciated. Lord Kingarth warmly toasted the island and Angus MacFadyen responded with an hilarious message. The occasion was organised by Alastair Scouller on behalf of the Hall Committee - nothing quite like this has been done for Colonsay before. A thoroughly good evening was enjoyed by all and it is hoped that this will become an annual event.

The new Hall in Colonsay is to cost £370,000 and the Committee has already been offered £250,00 of this from a combination of the Lottery's Millennium Fund, (£180,000), Argyll & Bute Council (£30,000) and Argyll and Islands Enterprise (£40,000). Argyll and Bute council has recommended this project to the Scottish Office for a contribution of £60,000. Since Colonsay is considered a very special area at the moment we consider it almost impossible that the Scottish Office will not make this offer. Once we have this amount confirmed all the "public" money which has so far been pledged on condition that the rest is raised will be confirmed.

Through their own efforts and through donations from private trusts, individuals and businesses the islanders have raised nearly £60,000 - a quite extraordinary sum and the result of endless hard work. Fund raising will continue all through this year right up to and after the Grand Opening. In order to bring the proposed building into the currently agreed price of £370,000, quite a number of modifications were made to the original ideal scheme and some extras have been excluded. If we can raise more money this summer some of these can be re-instated and some extra equipment could be purchased. The New Hall is scheduled for completion in time for New Year's Day 2000 and the building contractor has effectively been chosen. However, no contract can be formally signed with him until the committee gets written approval from the major funding partners. It is hoped that the Scottish Office will announce their award within the next ten days and that work will start in April. The building should therefore be finished by November in time for a formal opening ceremony and, of course for New Year 2000."

NATIONAL TARTAN DAY U.S.A.

On 20th March 1998 the Congress of the United States of America designated April 6th each year as National Tartan Day to recognise the outstanding achievements and contributions made by Scottish Americans to the United States. Senate Resolution 155 was carried unanimously with a preamble carrying the opening statements:

"Whereas April 6 has a special significance for all Americans, and especially those Americans of Scottish descent, because the Declaration of Arbroath, the Scottish Declaration of Independence, was signed on April 6, 1320 and the American Declaration of Independence was modelled on that inspirational document;

Whereas this resolution honours the major role that Scottish Americans played in the founding of this Nation, such as the fact that almost half of the signers of the Declaration of Independence were of Scottish descent, the Governors in 9 of the original 13 States were of Scottish ancestry, Scottish Americans successfully helped shape this country in its formative years and guide this Nation through its most troubled times.......

.....Now, therefore, be it

Resolved, That the Senate designates April 6 of each year as "National Tartan Day".

No Mention of Colonsay Farmers

A local (Australian) press item reports:-

"Crafty crofters on Scottish islands are wangling cheap ferry trips to the mainland - by taking their sheep on holiday with them. Now ferry company Caledonian MacBrayne is reviewing a discount scheme meant to help them take livestock to market.

Under the scheme the company charges just over £2 per animal and nothing for the vehicle as long as the crofter - and at least one animal - is going to market. But there have been rumours of crofters from Uist taking a sheep across to Oban, and leaving it with friends in Argyll while they go on shopping trips and holidays in Inverness, Glasgow and Edinburgh.

'They then come back with the sheep in the car and say the price was too low and they did not sell' said a crofter on Barra who insists he did not take part."

 area, which runs south from Ballycastle past Bonamargy Friary to Orra Mountain, and were likely to have
 settled there in the early 1600's.
 - Prominent Clan Macfie members would seem to include the Rt. Rev. James Mahaffy, Church of Ireland Bishop of Derry and Raphoe, and Mr. Patrick John McAfee, Director of Bankers Morgan Grenfell & Co. Ltd., London.
 - <u>Dr. William McAfee</u>, Lecturer in History at the University of Ulster, Coleraine, spoke on "Researching Families in Townlands" at the Family History Conference "The Wild Gees of '98" in Belfast and Dublin 1 8 September last year.
 - Analysis of <u>Irish Telephone Directories</u> reveals how few Clan Macfie names exist in Nationalist Ireland. Nil, in Dublin, is followed by 1 McPhee in Cork; nil in Leinster; nil in Wexford; nil in Limerick and 1 Mahaffy in Donegal. As expected, Northern Ireland has plenty of McAfee; plenty of Duffy; plenty of Fee; a few Mahaffy and Mahaffey; only 5 McPhee; just 2 McFee; 4 O'Fee; just 1 McGuffie and no Cathies or McDuffies. But which one would be pronounced "McAfee" in Antrim?
